Early Morning Work

- In the mornings when the children come in we practise name writing, number formation or fine motor skills.
- Here are some ideas for helping your child with their fine motor skills at home:

What Are Fine Motor Skills?

Practising fine motor skills requires children to focus and control their hands.

Fine motor skills help a child's small hand, wrist and finger muscles strengthen and grow.

Fine motor skills help children complete important tasks, like writing, drawing, zipping up their jackets or tying their shoelaces.

Adults can encourage and support children with their fine motor skills by introducing children to activities that will help strengthen their hand, wrist, fingers muscles and concentration skills.

Some fine motor skills activities that children love, include:

- 1. Puzzles
- 2. Modelling dough
- 3. Building bricks
- 4. Colouring
- 5. Finger painting
- 6. Drawing in sand
- 7. Threading/Beading
- 8. Kid-friendly tweezers and pom poms
- 9. Pegboards
- 10. Hammer and nails
- 11. Peeling stickers
- 12. Putting coins in a money box





- We follow a scheme called Supersonic Phonic Friends
- Variety of characters that help the children learn how to read and write
- Phonics twice a day
- Introduce a new letter/sound every morning then practise reading and writing with the new sound in the afternoon
- On Mondays we do a mini assessment to see which sounds your child knows and match their book to their individual knowledge
- Weekly newsletter will be posted to Tapestry for ideas on how to support your child at home
- Parent training on the 23rd





- For our daily English lessons we have 'drawing club'
- We read a different story each week
- We rotate on a three week cycle between a story a traditional tale an animation
- The children then come to Drawing Club to draw a picture of something linked to the story.
- Builds vocabulary gives every child 1:1 time with us
- Eventually leads to writing about the picture



Handwriting




We use the letter-join programme to teach handwriting from EYFS to Year 4.

Children are able to access this at home via a desktop or tablet at <u>https://www.letterjoin.co.uk/log-in.html</u> using the appropriate login.

Children can click on their class name to practice specific handwriting skills related to their year group or 'free play' for a range of skills.

Snack

We have rolling snack in Foundation (mostly).

This means the children have the snack out throughout the morning (fruit) and afternoon (additional snack) and they can choose when to have it.

Milk is available for those that have signed up.

Children encouraged to try different foods and given lots of reminders to have snack but we do not make them have it if they choose not to.





- The children will read to an adult in school and change their books on a weekly basis (please put their Reading books in book bags every day)
- Reading (every evening where possible please)
- Practise sound flashcards daily linked to the weekly newsletter
- There is no set homework day, but we may ask you to support with certain areas throughout the year.
