Lesson	Activity	Guidance for Parents
1 PHSE	<p>Trailer game.</p> <p>It is nice at times to relax and enjoy a game together. This game is like snakes and ladders.</p> <p>If you land on top of the train track, you need to go to the end of the track. If you land on the trailer you go up to the top of the tractor.</p>	<p><i>A game of snakes and ladders linked to the theme. You could make your own dice, use a spinner or find ways of working out how to take turns.</i></p>
2 P.E	<p>Our theme this week in P.E. is 'On the farm'</p> <p>Can you remember the actions for the different farm animals?</p> <p>Cows- on all fours. Rabbit- squat down with hands on the floor, Pig - rolling from side to side in the mud, Ducks- arms flapping.</p> <p>When an adult says- The sheep dog is coming- you start to jog again in the area.</p> <p>What was your favourite farm animal movements? Can you link them together? Can you do 1 animal move for 8 counts and then change to another animal move for another 8 moves. See if you can do this in time with the music.</p>	<p><i>There is a music file which you can use as you carry out this activity.</i></p> <p><i>Encourage your child to think about the different animals and movements they will make.</i></p> <p><i>This week to listen to the beat of the music</i></p>
3 Art	<p>Animal Crafts.</p> <p>Why not see what you have to make a farm animal. There are some ideas on the sheet to make a sheep, goat or a lovely carrot. Why not see if you can make a 3d animal or a mask. You could then use this when you do P.E for acting out the animals moves.</p>	<p><i>The children really enjoy making arts and crafts and can be quite creative. Let them have a go at making a 3d animal or mask and enjoy their creativity.</i></p>
4 Geography	<p>What machines do they use on a farm?</p> <p>I think we all know that you might find a tractor on a farm, but did you know there are other machines used on a farm. The machines do different jobs.</p> <p>You might need to do a little bit of research to find out what the machines are used for. They have different jobs to help on the farm and help the different crops to grow. There is a sheet with some of the machines, can you add a sentence to say what they are used for on a farm.</p>	<p><i>We are looking at the different types of machinery. Can they recognise the machines, their names and what they are used for.</i></p>

Paper Plate Sheep



Supplies

- Paper plate
- Cotton wool balls
- PVA glue
- Paintbrush or glue spreader
- Black card
- Googly eyes
- Scissors
- Pencil
- White coloured pencil



Handprint Goat

Supplies

- A4 paper or card
- Paint
- Shallow tray/paper plate
- Paintbrush
- Black felt tip pen
- Scissors
- PVA glue
- Cotton wool



- 1 First, choose a paint colour for your goat and carefully press your hand into the paint. You may want to use a paintbrush to spread the paint all over your hand. Next, carefully press your hand onto the paper. Your thumb and fingers need to be spread out! Wash and dry your hands before proceeding onto the next step.
- 2 Once dry, you can draw some details onto your goat! Turn the print so that the fingers are at the bottom. Use the black pen to draw a face and ears onto your goat's head - don't forget to draw some horns!
- 3 Then, stick a little cotton wool onto the opposite side from your thumbprint for the goat's fluffy tail.
- 4 Next, stick a little cotton wool onto the goat's chin for a fluffy beard!
- 5 Now, colour the remaining four fingertip prints black, for your goat's hooves.
- 6 Finally, you may like to carefully cut around the outside of your goat, to make the shape of it stand out.

Footprint Carrots

Supplies

- A4 sized blue card or paper
- Brown card or paper
- Orange paint
- White paper
- Green card or pipe cleaners
- Sticky tape



- 1 Using the paintbrush, cover each foot in orange paint. Then print onto white paper and leave to dry. Don't forget to wash your feet afterwards!
- 2 Wait until dry and then using scissors, cut around the footprints.
- 3 Cut out strips of green card and stick them onto the back of each footprint at the toe end. Alternatively you could use green pipe cleaners.
- 4 Now make the background scene. To do this, take the blue paper/card and lay it horizontally. Then stick some brown card or paper along the bottom of the paper (this will be the soil). Finally, stick the carrots onto the paper.
