

#### WHERE WILL THE CLUBS BE RUN?



### Our Curriculum





This week might have been 4 days- but still lots of business going on. We have been enjoying the story of Mrs Armitage and her bike. She made lots of adaptions and we drew what we would put on our bike. We have been working hard on number 10 - finding different ways of making 10 and finding different ways of saying this. Ask us if we can remember at home. In PE we had more practise for Sports Day- this week it was long distance. It is quite a way to go round the track, fortunately Mrs Smith was able to show us the way!. We are trying to improve our garden area and have begun planting some herbs and seeds. We are excited to see how they grow.



We have been working super hard in Year 1 this week. In English we have been focusing on capital letters; making sure they are written correctly and in the right place in a sentence. In Maths we have been learning about position and direction, starting off with left and right turns. In Science we learnt about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. Ask us what the difference is. Being able to do PE outside in the sunshine has been fun too. We have been perfecting how to jump correctly and safely. In Art we had a go at observational drawing.



We've had another busy week in Year 2 this week, even with the Bank Holiday Monday! It's been lovely to be outside on the field at break and lunchtimes and we have enjoyed having both PE sessions in the sunshine as we work on our fitness and fielding and striking skills. In English, we have started our new unit which is persuasive texts - are your children using any of the techniques we have been learning? They are trying to persuade Mrs Mugford and Mrs Lee to let them know what is in the Mystery Box but they haven't succeeded yet! In Maths, we are continuing to practice fractions and have been working on finding a half, third and quarter of an amount. Knowing that the denominator means how many equal parts we need to divide our whole into is something we are trying really hard to remember each time! Next week we will be having our 'Abacus Has Got Talent' first round which we are all really excited for!



This week, we have been learning more about Ancient Egyptians. We learned about some of the many gods/goddesses they believed in and we looked at some artefacts and what they may have been used for. We also made some Egyptian paper in Art. In Maths, we have been learning how to tell the time. Please encourage your children to tell you the time often using an analogue and digital clock to support them with this. In GPS, we have been recapping word classes - noun, adjective, adverb and verb.



English: We have started looking at our new text. It is a 'Suspense Tale...' The book we are linking our text to is called 'Escape to Pompeii' by Christina Balit. The children are really enjoying it so far. On Thursday the children wrote a poem about a volcano while thinking about the 5 senses. Maths: We have been using our decimal knowledge and linking it to money. We've been converting pounds to pence and ordering money. Science: The children had great fun on Tuesday watching a real-life demonstration about the digestive system and what happens as the food travels around the body. Spellings: Our focus for this week has been about words containing 'sol' and 'real'. Ask your child if they remember any of them and can they spell them correctly? Reading: The book we are studying at the moment is '100 Facts about Vikings'. Can your child recall any information that they have read?



This week in Year 5 we have been we have been writing an innovation of the text 'Anglo Saxon Boy' focussing on adding detail and description to interest the reader. In Maths we have been finishing off our topic of decimals and will be moving on to perimeter and area. In Science we dissected a plant to find out how plants reproduce. Ask your child if they can tell you the ways that seed dispersal happen. And in History we will be looking at how Anglo-Saxon Britain was ruled.



It's been another busy week in Year 6! We've been enjoying reading more of our class book and discovering whether our predictions are correct as we reach the climax of the story. We've had fun doing more active Maths revision as well as playing fraction, decimal and percentage top trumps and competing against our peers with an arithmetic Kahoot! We've practised answering 3 mark questions when reading, ensuring that we back up our points with evidence from the text. In GPS, we've completed murder mysteries and played different TV quiz shows such as Pointless and Deal or No Deal! We look to seeing everyone for a delicious breakfast at 8 am on Monday!
